

THE ROTARY CLUB OF CARROLL CREEK COMMUNITY SERVICE COMMITTEE GUIDELINES FOR FUNDING

The Rotary Club of Carroll Creek (RCCC) works to bring Rotary International's mission to life in Frederick County. Rotary International's mission is to provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through its fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders.

RCCC accepts applications for funding to support projects and programs that meet the community needs of Frederick County.

Please note that funds are limited, even more so this year due to pandemic-related reduction in fundraising revenues. This grant program is competitive. For the best consideration, please clearly and thoroughly communicate how your request aligns with the funding objectives and evaluation criteria. Do not assume grant reviewers have any prior knowledge of your project, program, or organization.

Fiscal Year 2022 Funding Timeline

November 19, 2021 – FY22 Applications Due to grants@carrollcreekrotary.org by End of Business

November 20 through December 17, 2021 - RCCC Review Period

January 3, 2022 – Applicants are Notified of Funding Status

January 19, 2022 7:15 a.m. – Checks Awarded - Recipients are invited to attend RCCC meeting (virtual or in-person TBD) where grant recipients and projects will be recognized.

June 24, 2022 – Deadline for Applicants to Submit Year End Reports

Eligibility Guidelines:

All grant activities must:

- 1. Relate to the mission of The Rotary Foundation. The Mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.
- 2. Fund activities that have been reviewed and approved for funding **before** the start of their implementation (i.e., FY22 projects cannot start prior to January 19, 2022). Grants may not be used to reimburse organizations for activities and expenses already completed or in progress.

Grants cannot fund:

- 1. Continuous or excessive support of any one entity.
- 2. Establishment of a foundation, permanent trust, or long-term interest-bearing account.
- 3. Operating, administrative, or indirect program expenses of an organization. (i.e. salaries and operating expenses)
- 4. Activities for which the expense has already been incurred.

Funding Objectives:

Priority funding consideration is given to projects that meet one of more of the following objectives:

- Help children
- Involve the Carroll Creek / downtown Frederick area
- Impact the City of Frederick and Frederick County
- Support the ideals and objectives of Rotary International by:
 - Assisting the underprivileged
 - Promoting international goodwill and better understanding through cultural exchange (think globally, act locally)
 - o Improving health care
 - o Promoting the concept of community service throughout our community
 - o Promoting goodwill and better understanding through education
 - o Promoting awareness of the needs of our community
 - o Promoting philanthropy and service in our Rotary club
 - o Supporting projects that are consistent with the theme of the Rotary year as determined by the President of Rotary International and our Rotary club president and board

Evaluation Criteria:

Funding preference is given to programs and projects that:

- Are well planned
- Show a direct, measurable impact to the community
- Make a significant impact for money spent (e.g. fishing poles as opposed to fish)
- Promote "hands on" participation by our Rotary club members
- Enhance the identity/visibility of our Rotary club within the community

RCCC reviews each funding application based on the following criteria:

Volunteer Component	15 pts
Is there an opportunity for Rotary club members to participate in the project	
through volunteer community service?	
Matching Funds	20 pts
Are RCCC funds leveraged to secure matching funds from other sources?	
Promotes Goodwill	10 pts
Does the project meet the Rotary 4-Way Test?	
1. Is it the TRUTH?	
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?	
3. Will it build GOODWILL & BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?	
4. Will it be BENEFIICAL to all concerned?	
Needs Measure	25 pts
Is the project or program meeting a demonstrated need in the community?

Does the project or program adequately recognize RCCC for its contribution?
